Clarinda's master plan tactics include: Eat Well – outdoor water filling stations located at the city park; Move More – offer a variety of fitness programs in multiple community settings, safe routes to school, complete walking audit for enhanced walking and bikeability; Feel Better – establish tobacco free-nicotine free places throughout Clarinda.

**Home Base Iowa community:** In July 2019, the City of Clarinda became the 94th Home Base Iowa community. Home Base Iowa is a one-of-a-kind program to connect veterans and transitioning service members with more than 2,200 businesses statewide. Governor Kim Reynolds and Lt. Governor Adam Gregg, along with other state and local officials, attended the event held at American Legion Sergy Post 98 in Clarinda.
