PAGE COUNTY FAIR

It's almost that time once again! The Page County Fair is right around the corner! The theme for this year is "Lasso Your Legacy" and it will be held July 21 st-27th.

There is something for everyone at the Page County Fair, from watching the livestock shows, attending the grandstand events, eating at the Clover Café during the day or the carnival at night with games, food booths and fun. Please watch the Page County 4-H Facebook page and the Page County Fair – Clarinda, Iowa Facebook page for updates and more information throughout the fair.

Many events happen before the fair. The Clover Kid pre-fair events include Cupcake Decorating, project show and tell, Clover Kid Table Setting, and Clover Kid Awardrobe. The 4-H pre-fair events are as follows: Milk Made Magic, a competition where youth prepare food products using milk based products that cannot be exhibited at the fair; Cook This, where each age division has different challenge items to use in their recipe; Awardrobe, where youth model clothing for fashion review, clothing selection, \$20 challenge and/or innovative design; Table Setting where youth can compete in the formal or casual division; Communications, which includes educational presentations, working exhibits, extemporaneous speaking and share the fun; Fair Shoot for the Shooting Sports club members; and Cherry Pie Contest. Pies are made at Wibholm Hall Kitchen and auctioned off at the Kick-off BBQ.

All 4-H and FFA members will join the Page County Fair Board to set up the Page County Fairgrounds on July 19th. They will work on getting pens, stalls, and cages set up and ready for animals. They will be preparing their carnival booths, setting up for judging, and getting the fairgrounds ready for the week of events and activities.

Monday, July 21st – The Cake Boss and Cookie Decorating will take place in Wibholm Hall 1:00 pm-3:00 pm. Exhibitors will bring their cookies already decorated and ready for judging. While the cookies are being judged, Cake Boss participants will be decorating their cakes at the event. Come watch these creative youth decorate their cakes! The Fair Kickoff BBQ will start at 5:00 pm with the awards portion beginning at 6:00 pm. The Fair Queen Coronation, Little Mr. & Miss crowning, Endowment Scholarship Awards, Senior Recognition, 4-H Hall of Fame recognition, State 4-H Recognition, and the cherry pie and cupcake auction will take place during the awards portion.

In the Spotlight

CL FABRICATION

CL Fabrication was incorporated May 7, 2010 and began business in the previous Hineline Furniture building located at 420 South 8th Street in Clarinda. This was totally done "on a wing and a prayer," because we had no idea what we were really going to be doing. Crazy, I know! At first, we just did some odd welding and fabricating jobs then, in 2011, we started manufacturing our very first tree pullers. They were a hit, so the next year we started manufacturing a wider variety of skid steer attachments. That total is well over 30 now, with the newest being a Brushcutter. This

product mounts to the front of a skid steer and can cut trees and brush up to 10" in diameter. We diversified our product line in 2022 when we added head transport trailers to our lineup. These trailers are used to haul corn or bean heads down the road. All of our products are manufactured, blasted/powder coated, and assembled right here in Clarinda, Iowa. We have sold all over the United States, Canada, and a few foreign countries. We use our own private brand, both for the head transports (Hull Mfg.) and the skid steer attachments (CL Fab), with our top seller being the "Dominator" tree and post puller. Our CL Fab name is building a nationwide reputation for being one of the best in the market, being "built super tough!" and "high quality!" Several of these products are patented or are patent pending.

This year marked our 15th Anniversary and many changes have occurred in those 15 years! To start, we went from 3 employees (Curtis, Lisa, and Lisa's dad, John Minard) to currently 17 full-time and 5 part-time employees. After purchasing our 14' press brake in 2012, the next major purchase was another processing item. We had been trailering our products to St Joseph, MO for powder coating. Seeing the need and benefit to having this done in-house, we decided to put in our own blast and powder coat system. In 2017, we purchased Katie's Greenhouse property, and in August of 2022, the buildings were removed to make the property a loading area for our products. In 2018, we purchased another processing item, our first Mitsubishi laser. In 2024, we added an 8,400 square foot hoop building to the south of the existing building to store our inventory. Currently, we are remodeling our offices to add more office space and next year, 2026 -2027, we will be preparing for an expansion to the East. We are looking forward to the future and are excited to see what the next 15 years will bring.





Tuesday, July 22nd – Static Judging for 4-H and FFA members will take place from 8:00 am-4:30 pm. Wibholm Hall will not be open to the public. Horse check-in and a horse exhibitor meeting will be held that evening. The fairgrounds will not be open to the public during horse check-in.

Wednesday, July 23rd – All buildings will be closed to the public. The horse show will start at 7:30am. The dog and pet show check-in begins at 10:30 am, with the show starting at 11:00 am in the show arena. The Open Class check-in will be 4:00 pm-7:30 pm in the South wing of Wibholm Hall. Junior Feeder calves will start check-in at 4:00 pm. Poultry check-in will begin at 5:00 pm. All other livestock will check in at 6:00 pm, with horse show speed events beginning at 7:30 pm. The livestock barns will be closed to the public during check-in to allow 4-H and FFA members a chance to get their animals settled in safely.

Thursday, July 24th – The Clover Café will be open from 7:00 am – 1:30 pm with a daily lunch special. New this year to the Clover Café, there are To-Go containers and a Pie and Coffee Social from 3:00 pm-5:00 pm. The goat show, including dairy and meat goats, will begin at 8:00 am, followed immediately by the sheep show. Wibholm Hall will be open from 10:00 am – 10:00 pm for the viewing of static exhibits. The Brokaw and Davis Rogers FFA Chapters will be hosting the Livestock Judging Contest with registration at 5:00 pm and the contest at 5:30 pm. The Carnival will open at 6:00 pm with the 4-H clubs and FFA Chapters operating all the games and food booths.

Friday, July 25th – The Clover Café will be open from 7:00 am – 1:30 pm with a new daily lunch special. New this year to the Clover Café, there are To-Go containers and a Pie and Coffee Social from 3:00 pm-5:00 pm. The swine show will be held in the show arena starting at 8:00 am. Wibholm Hall will be open from 10:00 am – 10:00 pm for the viewing of 4-H and FFA static exhibits. The 4-H and FFA poultry show will take place on the south side of the poultry/rabbit barn at 12:30 pm. Working Exhibits will be presented in the South End of Wibholm Hall at 3:00 pm. Share the Fun acts will be held in the pavilion following the Awardrobe fashion show, starting at 6:00 pm. 



The business visits the class at least once each quarter.


Businesses are encouraged to invite the class to their business for the last quarter visit.
