70TH ANNUAL SOUTHWEST IOWA BAND JAMBOREE

The 70th Annual Southwest Iowa Band Jamboree, Clarinda's longest-running musical event, is scheduled for Saturday, October 4. The parade begins at 9 a.m. around the Clarinda Downtown square with over 45 bands from high school and middle school bands across Iowa, Missouri, and Nebraska. This event draws more than 2,500 students, parents, and spectators to Clarinda for the day-long festival.

Field activities begin at 12:45 p.m. at the Clarinda High School Football Stadium, starting with a flag-raising ceremony led by the American Legion Sergy Post No. 98. Admission is \$5 for adults and \$3 for students.

Following the ceremony, the University of Iowa Hawkeye Marching Band will take the field for their exhibition performance. After their performance, parade awards will be announced.

The Clarinda High School Marching Band will then present their exhibition show, leading into the afternoon field competition. The event will conclude with an awards ceremony at approximately 6:00 p.m.

This year's Southwest Iowa Band Jamboree Chairperson is Katy Ridge, and Vice Chairperson is Julie Murren. The Southwest Iowa Band Jamboree is co-sponsored by the Clarinda Chamber of Commerce, the Clarinda Community Schools, and the City of Clarinda.

CLARINDA FIRE DEPARTMENT 150 YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

The Clarinda Fire Department will be celebrating our 150 years of service with an open house on October 11th, 2025, from 11:00 am-2:00 pm, at the Fire Station.

At the open house, we will have food for everyone — hot dogs, hamburgers, chips, water and donuts. We will be passing out fire prevention materials and smoke alarms for those families in need

(2 per family). We will have a kids' water fight station set up, adults can try on the gear and use the fire hose, lots of fun things to do, also you can tour the station and check out all the trucks and equipment. A flyer

with more details will be shared soon.

It is hard to imagine, when you stop to think about it and visualize 150 years ago and what the Clarinda Fire Department members had to work with and all the hardships they had to endure. We have old photos to be able to look at the equipment they started with and then watch the progress over the years, to me, it is just amazing. From the bucket brigades, to the horses and steam pumpers, to the motorized firetrucks, and each decade, the progress of the trucks and equipment jumped by leaps and bounds. The gear they were wearing was just basically boots, a coat, probably not fire rated



by any means, and sometimes a helmet of some sort, no breathing equipment until later on down the road, some very brave people.

I started on the dept. in 1980, and the changes from then to now are so amazing, from the gear we wear and the equipment we use, to the trucks and vehicles we use. From the long rubber boots and gloves, and long coats to the leather boots and gloves and Nomex bunker gear. We have breathing apparatus that have communication systems in the facepiece, before, it just yelling to be heard. So many things have evolved, extrication equipment, air bags, ventilation fans, roof saws, and grain bin rescue tools. It has been a huge change from just when I started, it will be very interesting, just to see the future changes that will occur in my lifetime, I can't imagine the changes in another 150 years.

KMA BROADCASTING CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

KMA Broadcasting was founded by Earl May in August 1925. Located on 960 AM with a power of 5,000 watts, KMA was a marketing tool for May and his new Seed and Nursery Company.

The station has a deep tradition of serving the rural 4-state region we now refer to as KMAland. Earl's son Ed May continued the tradition of providing public service, information, and entertainment until his retirement in the 80s.

Ed May, Jr, along with his family, owned and operated KMA Broadcasting until selling the station in 2019.

The station is now owned by a group of nine local investors as KMAland Broadcasting LLC and not only includes the original KMA 960 AM, but also KMA 99.1 FM broadcasting at 100,000 watts of power.

In addition to connecting with KMAland over the radio waves, KMAland. com reaches tens of thousands of viewers every month.

For the last 100 years, the station has made a commitment to providing local news, ag information, sports, community events and so much more. In addition to local information, KMA is home to Kansas City Royals and St. Louis

Cardinals baseball, Iowa State football and men's basketball and syndicated network news programming through ABC.


CLARINDA HOMECOMING CELEBRATION







