A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Each year, I'm asked to write an article for the Chamber newsletter. I usually write about the things the city has been working on or is planning for in the upcoming year. This year I thought I would talk about something different but just as important.

This year, 2026, is an election year. We are not voting for the President of the United States, but we will be electing candidates that will shape our state, county, and city for the future. At the national level, Joni Ernst will not be seeking re-election. She has been our senator for ten years. She is a resident of Southwest Iowa and has a very good understanding of the issues we face in rural Iowa. I hope her replacement will be just as informed and an advocate for Iowa.

At the state level, Governor Kim Reynolds is also not seeking re-election. She has been the leader of the executive branch in Iowa for fourteen years. First as Lieutenant Governor under Governor Branstad and then Governor for the last eight years. It is also very likely that we will have a new State Auditor and Attorney General.

At the county level, the citizens of Page County decided at last year's elections to expand the number of county supervisors from three to five. A committee was formed to redraw the county into five equal districts based on population to guarantee equal representation. All five of the supervisor seats are up for election this year. I believe this decision was made to ensure a broader viewpoint on the issues that the county faces.

I want to make this perfectly clear. I am not endorsing any candidate for the positions I have mentioned. I would not and will never tell someone how to vote or who to vote for. That is a personal choice and must be decided by each individual. I will, however, tell anyone who asks how important it is to vote. Voting is a right and privilege for every citizen of this country, and it should not be taken lightly. I have heard people say our votes do not count, that the politicians don't listen, and will do what they want. I do not believe that it is true, it's just that sometimes the answer we want to hear is not possible.

To get to the point of this article, I want to strongly encourage everyone to pay close attention to the candidates running for office and the issues they stand for. These individuals are the ones who will be setting policies and passing laws that will affect your daily lives for the foreseeable future.

I want to leave you with this final thought. I believe we live in a great country, state, and city. It is not the government that makes us great; it's the people. I believe in the people of Clarinda, and I know we all strive to make our city the best it can be. God Bless, and I hope 2026 is a great year for everyone.
